That's why we joined the Missing Maps initiative, a program which addresses the need humanitarian organizations have for maps of the areas where we work.

MSF offers Canadian companies the opportunity to host a Mapathon, an engaging event where your employees will be able to map a wide geographical area using OpenStreetMap. By hosting a Mapathon, your employees can volunteer their time and skills to help MSF continue providing emergency medical care where its needed most.

The photos seen here are from MSF's malaria project in Burundi in 2020. The project used data collected at mapathons for a systematic approach to spraying houses with insecticide. Indoor residual spraying is an important technique for malaria prevention and it was a key factor in an 80 per cent decrease of cases in Kinyinya district. Equipped with geolocation devices, the team is able to track their daily progress of houses sprayed.
